A memorial service will be held January 11 for Richard Bond Bell, 44, a Boston Banker who died December 20 at Lahey Clinic Medical Center in Burlington after a brief illness.

Mr. Bell, who lived in Boston, was born in Worcester, where he attended public schools. He graduated from high school in Pensacola, Florida, then attended the New England School of Accounting and Clark University.

He also received a master's degree from Williams College in Williamstown.

Mr. Bell was comptroller of Bank Hapoalim in Boston. He had worked previously as a loan officer at Mechanic's Bank in Worcester and as the treasurer of University Bank and Trust in Framingham and of BayBank, New Bedford.

He was a member of the Worcester Jaycees, Worcester Economics Club, Newton Bankers Association, Worcester Area Chamber of Commerce, American Management Association, Small Business Administration Task Force and Newton Chamber of Commerce.

He leaves his parents, Everett and Christine Bell; and a brother, Everett G. Bell, Jr., all of Marietta, Georgia.
